It will take place on Saturday 14th March between 9:00 and 17:00. We will be running the following Scale competitions:

- Scale Free Flight Open (flying only), competing for the David Lloyd-Jones Cup
- Peanut Scale, competing for the Modellers Den Peanut trophy – Mike Stuart has won this for the last two years - who will challenge him in 2026 and take this impressive Trophy home?
- Pistachio Scale – BMFA Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates for podium places.

For 2026 a new Trophy will be up for grabs at the Gala. The Roy Lever Jet-X Trophy will be awarded to the competitor who in the opinion of the Judges and Contest CD displays the "Spirit and endeavor of Scale aeromodelling."

The Gala also provides a wonderful opportunity to trim out your model in advance of the Scale Indoor Nationals.

Plan of the month – Comet Westland Wallace

I love a good Swap Meet and recently attended the Telford MFC event held in Shifnal Shropshire.

Often Swap Meets tend to be very much outdoor RC orientated but to those who like a challenge and are prepared to search through boxes and under tables there are often some real gems waiting to be discovered!

I was overjoyed to find a vendor selling older free flight scale kits, from both UK and American manufacturers, many of the kits dating from the prewar period.

I spied a vintage Westland Wallace Comet Kit in his box of goodies.

Developed by Westland as the successor to the Wapiti, The Wallace was the last of the interwar general-purpose biplanes.



Designed by Alex Horback and first kitted by Comet in 1935, the contents of the kit were complete, even down to including a glass phial of dope, which I've not opened!
