The FFTC will have a pre-entry available on their website. Regrettably the daily fees will have to rise to £20.00 for one day (fly as many contests as you like) £35.00 for two days and £45.00 for three days. Entry on the day will be available but will have a £5.00 surcharge = £25.00.
